METAVERSE

WHAT

The metaverse is the latest buzzword to capture Facebook's imagination. A combination of the prefix "meta", meaning beyond, and "universe", it's a world of endless, interconnected virtual communities where people can meet, work and play, using virtual reality headsets, augmented reality glasses, smartphone apps or other devices. In other words, it refers to shared virtual worlds where land, buildings, avatars and even names can be bought and sold, using cryptocurrency.

WHY

metaverse could be a game-changer for the work-from-home shift. Instead of seeing co-workers on a video call grid, employees could see them virtually. In the words of Victoria Petrock, an analyst, "It's the next evolution of connectivity where all of those things start to come together in a seamless, doppelganger universe, so you're living your virtual life the same way you're living your physical life."

IS IT JUST A FB PROJECT?

No. Consumer brands are getting in on it, too. Italian fashion house Gucci collaborated in June with Roblox to sell a collection of digital-only accessories. Coca-Cola and Clinique have sold digital tokens pitched as a stepping stone to the metaverse. Video game companies also are taking a leading role. Epic

Games, the company behind the popular Fortnite video game, has raised \$1 billion from investors to help with its long-term plans for building the metaverse. Game platform Roblox is another big player, outlining its vision of the metaverse as a place where "people can come together within millions of 3D experiences to learn, work, play, create and socialise."

Younger people within G20 want bold climate actions: Poll

■ The most popular climate policies among under-18s in the G20 countries surveyed were conservation of forests and land (59 per cent), using


solar, wind and renewable power and using climate-friendly farming techniques (both 57 per cent). ■ Support for these policies

was stronger among young people by three percentage points for the first two policies, and by 4% for climate-friendly farming

A major poll of public opinion on climate change in the G20 countries published on Monday by the UN Development Programme (UNDP) and the University of Oxford shows how public support for climate action is set to strengthen in the near future, as climate-aware teenagers become of voting age, enter the workforce, and move into positions of greater influence. In all of the G20 countries surveyed, a majority of under-18s said they believed climate change is a global emergency, ranging from Argentina and Saudi Arabia (63 per cent), to Italy and the UK (86 per cent).

The new poll, called the 'G20 Peoples' Climate Vote', surveyed over 689,000 people, including over 302,000 people under the age of 18, and has been published ahead of a crucial G20 summit in Rome this weekend, and the COP26 climate talks in Glasgow next week

'More contagious' mutant scaring UK found in India too




CORONA UPDATE

The new mutated form (AY.4.2) of the coronavirus that has caused panic in Europe – it's presumably more contagious than Delta – is present in India "in very low numbers", said scientists of the INSACOG network monitoring variations in SARS-CoV-2. Dr Anurag Agrawal, director at the CSIR Institute of Genomics and Integrative Biology (IGIB) in Delhi, said: "AY.4.2 is present in India based on the revised definition, but at very low numbers, less than 0.1%." IGIB is one of the main laboratories involved in the INSACOG genomic surveillance exercise. He added further details and the exact number of AY.4.2 in India would be available soon. AY.4.2 is a descendant of the Delta variant, which has so far been considered the most dangerous form, affecting millions.

AY.4.2 is suspected to be the cause for the exponential rise in Covid cases in the UK, Russia (a lockdown will start in Moscow next week) and Israel. However, scientists say the AY.4.2-related findings still carry a high level of uncertainty, and it is still early to say this lineage carries higher risk of illness and/or death.

Adele wants Idris Elba to be the next JAMES BOND







With the CISCE changing the exam pattern for year 2021-22, confusion among the students as well as the teaching fraternity has increased as the board opted for multiple choice questions and online testing mode for Semester 1. The students are perplexed as to how to prepare for this format. At the same time teachers are busy trying to decode how to prepare their students for the same. The Group III (Computer Application) students have totally gotten a 360 degree turn.

Certain important points which might come in handy and be relevant for Computer Application students are being reiterated. First and foremost the students need to be thorough with the basics and go through the textbooks without leaving any details as the questions can be asked from anywhere. Secondly, while revising they need to be thinking in reverse i.e. instead of thinking of how to answer the questions, they also need to think of about "How or in which way they can be questioned from a particular topic?". They also need to be very cautious while reading the questions especially the ones which use negative statements.

While attempting questions in Section A - thorough knowledge of theoretical concepts will help. Questions like predict the output or Q1 e) given above should always be answered after giving a dry run and not by mental calculations or guesswork.

While attempting Section- B the students need to understand the logic of the program given in the paper, analyze, work with the logic and then attempt to complete it. Understanding the concepts is of utmost importance as then only the students will be able to comprehend the logic. It's also equally important to mention that writing and practically solving the program questions is of utmost importance, as that is a sure shot method of getting the right logic and syntax and making you confident to face your exams.

For case study questions reading the passage, comprehending it and then choosing the most appropriate answer is really very important.


GET SET GO WITH GRAPHIC ORGANISERS


As a part of this project various activities are planned and are being conducted during science and social science classes

While South Africa were handed a five-wicket defeat by Australia, West Indies sank to six-wicket loss against England. It will be imperative that both sides improve upon their batting as they seek to register their first points in the group. Put to bat, both sides struggled to put runs on the board. West Indies were skittled for just 55 runs while the Proteas were a touch better, managing 118 in 20 overs thanks to Aiden Makram's 36-ball 40. South Africa's problem in recent games was one again on display in their opening clash. Playing with a top-heavy side, they were unable to overcome the loss of early wickets. While Markram held on to his wicket at the other end, the Proteas twice lost wickets in clusters of three. David Miller's woeful form and the inexperienced middle order didn't help their cause either. However,

In the game against England, the spinners were the undoing of West Indies and the Proteas will count on Shamsi and Maharanj to do the trick for them. South Africa will head into the clash with the psychology advantage, having inflicted a series defeat on the West Indies at home earlier this year. West Indies, on the other hand, will have to regroup fast after their disastrous campaign opener. The two-time champions will have to rethink their batting approach against South

Africa. Besides veteran Chris Gayle, none of the players managed to reach double digit scores. West Indies were guilty of losing nine of their 10 wickets while trying to hit a four or a six. None of the players attempted to rebuild the innings after early strikes. They seemed to have forgotten that rotating the strike was important when boundaries were difficult to come by. However, their batting line-up is studded with proven match-winners who can take away the game at any given point. Their bowling department did well to make the run chase as difficult as possible while the fielding was also top-notch. If West Indies had a better total, they'd have been in the game. Left-arm spinner Akeal Hosein (2/24) made a good impression with his quick balls and excellent fielding. Kieron Pollard and Co. will also have one eye on the net run-rate which sits at 3.970, which could come into play towards the end of the group stage.

PAKISTAN SEEK REVENGE AGAINST NEW ZEALAND

Pakistan will have "revenge" on their mind for a recent off-field snub when they take on New Zealand in the T20 World Cup, looking to build on the historic high of beating arch-rivals India in their tournament-opener. For a lot of Pakistani fans, the team may have already won the World Cup by ending its 29-year-old World Cup jinx against India but the Babar Azam-led team has already shown the hunger for going all the way. After the 10-wicket rout of India, Pakistan are fully capable of doing a Pakistan and



self-destructing against the Black Caps, something that Babar discussed with his players in the dressing room after the win on Sunday night. Former Pakistan captains too have cautioned the players against extended celebrations as the team needs to do a lot more to make the semifinals. Babar's team would be eyeing another big scalp in New Zealand, the team which recently withdrew from a scheduled series against Pakistan after landing there, citing a security threat which, according to the host country, did not exist.

SALAH hits hat-trick for LIVERPOOL

Liverpool inflicted a historic hammering on Manchester United in a 5-0 win at Old Trafford

For the first time in Premier League history, United trailed 4-0 at half-time and failed to score in a hopelessly one-sided contest. The Red Devils have now taken a run of one point from a possible 12 in the league. Naby Keita started the rout before Diogo Jota doubled Liverpool's lead inside 15 minutes. Salah then took centre stage to take his tally for the season to 15 goals in 12 appearances and become the top-scoring African player in Premier League history in the process. To round off a miserable day for United, Paul Pogba lasted less than 15 minutes as a second-half substitute as he was shown a straight red card for a reckless lunge that forced Keita to leave the pitch on a stretcher. Liverpool's first victory in front of a crowd at Old Trafford under Ju-

rgen Klopp moves them back above Manchester City into second, just a point behind leaders Chelsea. By contrast, United's hopes of a first league title since 2013 already look over as they remain eight points off the leaders. That gap is likely to grow in the coming weeks with Tottenham and City to come in the next fortnight before an international break. Whether Solskjaer will still be in charge come November is now in serious doubt as he has completely failed to form a balanced

team from a talented collection of star players. The Norwegian will wonder what might have been had Bruno Fernandes not fired over a glorious chance to open the scoring on three minutes. But soon the defensive cracks that have blighted United's season began to appear. Salah teed up Keita to open the floodgates after just five minutes with a composed low finish past David de Gea. Salah has now scored in 10 consecutive games. AFP

LIVERPOOL DISSECTED UNITED DEFENCE

Cristiano Ronaldo was lucky to avoid a red card as United's frustrations bubbled over in first-half stoppage time when he was booked for lashing out at Curtis Jones in a sign of what was to come as the home side lost their discipline. Liverpool inflicted further punishment before the break when Salah smashed home his 14th goal in 12 games this season at De Gea's near post. Salah then completed his hat-trick with another cool finish five minutes into the second-half after Jordan Henderson's pass dissected the United defence once more.






